


A Great Season for the Academy!

The British Real Tennis Academy is the UK national coaching program for the best young players in the country. It is run by the Dedanists Society and funded by the Society and the T&RA. The Academy works in 3 stages. We discover new talent, nuture them through top class coaching in our Cadet Squad, and then once they have developed as players, support them in their progress in the game. Last season the Academy took a bold decision and underwent a radical change. Under the guidance of Paul Weaver and Graham Tomkinson, the Academy has been considerably simplified to concentrate its efforts on the very best of our junior talent. As a result of this change, there are now just 3 national squads.

The effect has been dramatic with the top Academy players improving rapidly and winning numerous National and International tournaments (see below). This new format will now be the blueprint for the Academy going forward and will, we are sure, result in even more success to follow. The Society works with the Department of Sport Sciences at Brunel University to ensure that the design and content of Academy programmes include current research and best practice from the wider world of elite sport.

The Society funds programmes that support and complement Academy coaching. It sponsors junior tournaments that engage and motivate players and coaches such as the World Junior Championships, the British Under 21 & 24 and the British Girls Under 15 & 19 championships. It includes IIP apprentices in its Academy coaching sessions and helps the LRTA to fund its newlylaunched Girls' Academy. Paul Weaver is in charge of the Academy Programme as a whole.

We are delighted to announce the formation of a Girls Academy Squad. This currently consists of 15 girls from 6 different clubs. This Academy is 50% funded by the Society and 50% by the LRTA. We believe that junior girls' real tennis will be an area of considerable growth in the coming years, led by the girls at Wellington and Oratory. Darcie Blaber, who has performed exceptionally well in the Girl's Academy, has also been invited to attend a couple of the National Cadet Squad sessions in the coming season.
